

ORDINANCE NO. 2003- 5

IN RE THE MATTER OF BRINGING INTO THE COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM A PORTION OF THE PUBLIC ROAD NAMED STONEY POINT ROAD.

WHEREAS, the Hopkins County Fiscal Court on its own Petition has expressed the desire to bring into the County Road System a portion of a public road named Stoney Point Road, which is described with more particularity as starting with its intersection with Kentucky Highway 291 for a distance of one (1) mile ending just past the residence of David Stevens and whose width is 30 FT.

WHEREAS, notice was published according to KRS 178.050 and notices were placed at three public places in the vicinity of said road.

WHEREAS, two viewers were appointed by the Fiscal Court together with the County Road Supervisor, who viewed the proposed road establishment and reported in writing to a public hearing held on JULY 3, 2003.

WHEREAS, their report stated that the advantages which will result to the individual and public are: ADVANTAGES: GIVES SEVERAL PROPERTY OWNERS ACCESS TO THEIR PROPERTY AND ASSURES THEM A ROAD THAT IS MAINTAINED.

WHEREAS, the Hopkins County Fiscal Court finds that establishment of the subject road is in the public interest in the following respects: GRANTS PROPERTY OWNERS ACCESS TO THEIR  
PROPERTY.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of Hopkins County that the above-described portion of the public road named Stoney Point Road shall be brought into the Hopkins County Road System.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon publication.

First reading of this Ordinance was held on JULY 3, 2003.

Upon motion of Magistrate ROGERS and seconded by Magistrate RIGGS, the ordinance, was approved for its first reading on JULY 3, 2003. Whereupon the vote was called, and on roll call, the vote stood:




